

# Good News INSPIRATION FOR DAILY LIFE

Saturday March 26 Hosea 6:1-6 Ps 51:3-4,18-21 Luke 18:9-14 How do you feel when someone who's hurtful or morally corrupt gets hit with a

hardship that makes them suffer? We rejoice because justice has been meted out.

Jesus says we cannot truthfully say that someone is a "greater sinner", even if that person is doing more damage, is more unChristian, or is blatantly an evil-doer.

Every person has been created in the image of God, even the worst ones. Those who display an opposite image are nonetheless loved by Christ, who died for them. It's a tragedy that they do not live as the person God created them to be. But it will be an even worse tragedy if no one invites them to turn their lives over to Christ.

Evil-doers are children of God living in ignorance of their true identity. They are victims of evil and were seduced into believing that it's

the best way to live. They don't understand that they can be healed by the Sinless One who conquered evil for their redemption. We should feel sorry for them -- this is the gift of mercy. We should mourn with Jesus for the tragedy that continues within their souls -- this is the most precious gift of mercy.

When we don't care enough to grieve over a person's inner destruction, we are sinning. We are disregarding what Jesus did for them on the cross. We are damaging our own souls.



Those who sinned against you are like the fig tree in Jesus' parable. If you have access to them, he wants you to till their

soil. He wants you to fertilize their souls with love and with the truth of the Gospel as taught by your actions and, when they're ready, by your words.

Notice that Jesus doesn't want us to keep a diseased, disintegrating tree in the garden forever. After we have done everything possible, if the evildoer refuses to change, the best care we can give to the garden is to cut down the tree. This means walking away or calling in the authorities. This, too, is loving. When fertilizer won't produce good fruits, a fallen tree becomes mulch and enriches the ground for a new beginning.

#### Reflect & Discuss:

- VVho has been so hurtful that you wish God would punish them?
- Can you feel sorry for them? Can you pray for God to do good for them? In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, ask for God's help in feeling more concerned about them. In this, you'll find freedom from the anger that has been holding you captive.
- VVhat steps can be taken to fertilize the lives of the problematic people of your parish or family?
- 4. How do you know when it's time to continue trying and when it's time to chop the tree down?

## **CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD**

During the 10:30 a.m. Sunday Mass, children ages 4-7 are dismissed during the Liturgy of the Word. They return to the worshipping community for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

## FIRST PENANCE & FIRST EUCHARIST

If you have a child who is or will be 7 years old in the Fall and is expecting to celebrate their first Penance and receive their first Eucharist in the Spring of the next year, the following conditions must be met: Attend separate class; one year previous religious education, either CCD or Catholic School; complete and submit a religious education/CCD registration form;

## **CONFIRMATION PREPARATION**

If have a child who will be entering 11<sup>th</sup> grade in the Fall and is expecting to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation in the Spring, the following conditions must be met: A letter handwritten by the candidate submitted to the Pastor by October 1 requesting the Sacrament; submit a completed and signed Sponsor eligibility form; one year previous religious education, either CCD or Catholic School; attend Sacramental Preparation Classes.

## **EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF COMMUNION**

All ministers must be confirmed and in a valid Catholic marriage, recommended by the pastor, and approved by the bishop for a three-year term which is indefinitely renewable.

## **COLD & FLU PRECAUTIONS**

Our response to cold and flu should continue to be guided by recommendations from our health officials. During 'flu seasons', they are recommending extra caution which includes:

- Those who are feeling ill stay at home so as not to spread the disease;
- Increased vigilance in washing hands and not touching our own eyes, mouth, or nose;
- Coughing and sneezing into disposable tissues (and washing one's hands afterwards), or if none available, the inside of one's forearm to reduce spreading any virus;
- Getting the current flu and pneumonia vaccination;

Whenever there is a report of a disease outbreak, it is often asked if we would stop the shaking of hands at the Sign of Peace. However, that 'solution' ignores the fact that colds and flu are also airborne viruses. Those who are infected can spread such viruses simply through breathing, let alone sneezing and coughing. Also, if someone's hands are infected, then those hands also touch door handles, tops of pew, hymnals, etc... and spread the virus to those surfaces. If the touch of hands is to be excluded at the Sign of Peace to avoid 'contact germs,' then one would also have to refrain from touching anything in the church that those infected hands have also touched, which is nearly impossible to do. The absolutely best way for colds and flu to be kept from spreading is for those who have them to self-quarantine.

## **REGISTRATION/CENSUS**

Do you consider Mary, Mother of Jesus Parish "home"? Do you worship with us regularly? If you have not done so already, we ask that you please register in our parish. Forms for this purpose are available in the church or online at <a href="https://www.mmjchurch.org">www.mmjchurch.org</a>. Adult children no longer living at home and recently married couples are especially encouraged to register. In this way we can serve you better. It also facilitates sponsorship for baptisms and confirmations, religious education registration, etc.

## ANOINTING OF THE SICK

This sacrament should no longer be considered exclusively for the dying, as in "last rites". It is to be celebrated by and for those whose health has been seriously impaired by illness or old age. Anyone may be anointed before surgery or an invasive test or medical procedure. Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present. The sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after being anointed and then again falls ill or if during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious. This is one more way that God imparts to each of us, and in particular at this time to the seriously ill and elderly his endless love and grace. Please contact Fr. Paul if you would like to be anointed.
